Take photographs/make rubbings of some of the names on the memorial. Imagine their story, or find out about their real lives. Be respectful when you visit. Present your work however you choose.	Interview an elderly person about their memories of the war or research and write about a relative's experience of the war. Perhaps they were an evacuee, a soldier, a nurse... Write about the interview or make a film/audio recording.	In HG Wells' classic novel 'War of the Worlds', the aliens which invaded Earth came from Mars. People have long had a fascination about 'The Red Planet'. Find out about Mars and make a presentation. Your presentation could include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mars facts and figures, maps and data • Information about mars exploration • Information about mankind's plans to travel to Mars
Bake a cake to a war time recipe.	Design a persuasive poster that persuades people to enlist as a soldier or a nurse.	Create a menu for a meal which could have been eaten by a family at home during the war? Remember that meat, potatoes and bread were in short supply! Or Find out about the kinds of meals that astronauts might eat in space and plan their weekly menu.	Create a World Map of who fought who (axis powers and the allies). Also identify occupied countries and those that were neutral. Include a key, show where they fought etc. There were at least 25 countries involved but you needn't include all of them!
Learn, perform and record a song from the 1940s. Or Learn and perform David Bowie's Space Oddity	Research an aircraft, ship or tank that took part in WW2. Make a model, drawing or collage and don't forget to include a description Or Make a model of a space craft or satellite	Make a dramatic drawing, painting or collage using different materials that shows a scene from World War 2.	Make an orrery. It doesn't have to have moving parts! https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Orrery
Come up with your own homework idea. Discuss it with Mr Wild first.	Which was better: Spitfire or Messerschmitt? Justify your decision. Present your work however you choose.	Make a film, audio recording, comic strip or animation about an Alien Invasion or about space travel.	Find out about and make a detailed presentation of one of the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The D-Day Landings 2. The Dunkirk Evacuation 3. The Battle of Britain 4. The Japanese attack of Pearl Harbour

Any internet research must be referenced (ask Mr Wild if you are unsure what this means). NEVER simply copy text from the internet - ALWAYS write it in your own words. Add your work to the class blog wherever possible. Feel free to use ICT wherever possible. Homework can be shared with Mr Wild electronically if you wish to avoid printing it out.

In addition to the homework above, it is expected that you will read for a minimum of 20-30 mins each night and record your reading in your reading record. You should also ensure you are learning your times tables each week and ensure that you are learning your spellings and completing your spelling homework each week.
