<p>Make a WW1 timeline. Include pictures, facts and dates.</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Make a timeline of astronomy and space exploration</p>	<p>Visit a war memorial. Take photographs/make rubbings of some of the names on the memorial. Imagine their story, or find out about their real lives. Be respectful when you visit.</p> <p>Present your work however you choose.</p>	<p>Interview an elderly person about their memories of the WW2 or research and write about a relative's experience of the war. Perhaps they were an evacuee, a soldier, a nurse...</p> <p>Write about the interview or make a film/audio recording.</p>	<p>In HG Wells' classic novel 'War of the Worlds', the aliens which invaded Earth came from Mars. People have long had a fascination about 'The Red Planet'.</p> <p>Find out about Mars and make a presentation. Your presentation could include:</p> <p>Mars facts and figures, maps and data</p> <p>Information about mars exploration</p> <p>Information about mankind's plans to travel to Mars</p>
<p>Bake a cake to a war time recipe.</p>	<p>Design a persuasive poster that persuades people to enlist as a soldier or a nurse in WW1 or WW2.</p>	<p>Make an orrery. It doesn't have to have moving parts!</p> <p><a href="https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Orrery">https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Orrery</a></p>	<p>Create a World Map of who fought in WW2 (axis powers and the allies). Also identify occupied countries and those that were neutral. Include a key, show where they fought etc. There were at least 25 countries involved but you needn't include all of them!</p>
<p>Learn and perform David Bowie's Space Oddity.</p> <p>You could film it if you like.</p>	<p>Research an aircraft, ship or tank that took part in WW1. Make a model, drawing or collage and don't forget to include a description</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Make a model of a space craft or satellite</p>	<p>Make a dramatic drawing, painting or collage using different materials that shows a scene from World War 1.</p>	<p>Create a menu for a meal which could have been eaten by a family at home during the war? Remember that meat, potatoes and bread were in short supply!</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Find out about the kinds of meals that astronauts might eat in space and plan their weekly menu.</p>
