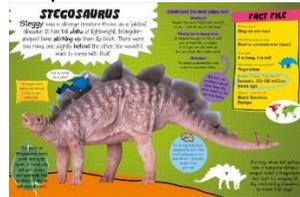


Create your own dinosaur world! Think about the type of habitat a dinosaur lived in - what would it have looked like? You might like to use an old shoe box and collect natural materials from the outdoor environment to create a suitable habitat. You could choose to represent your ideas on paper. You may even like to make your habitat outside and take a photo to bring in to show!

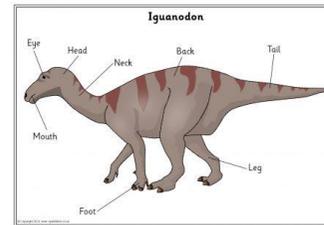


Choose your favourite dinosaur and create a fact file, poster, leaflet or book about it. We would love to hear all about your favourite dinosaur! You might like to include:

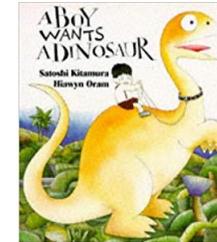
- name of dinosaur
- what they eat
- size
- what they look like



Design your own dinosaur and label it. Write about what it looks like, what it eats and where it lives.



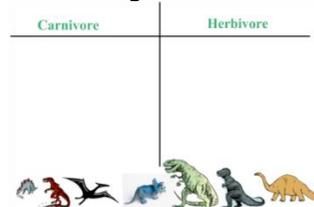
Write instructions on how to look after your pet dinosaur. Try to think of at least 5 instructions. You might like to read 'A Boy Wants a Dinosaur' first to give you some ideas (I have this book if you would like to borrow it).



Create a menu for a dinosaur restaurant. Be as imaginative as you like - you could include a starter, main and pudding. Remember some dinosaurs are 'vegetarians' (herbivores)!



Sort different dinosaurs into carnivores and herbivores. Put them into a table headed carnivores and herbivores listing them underneath.



Share what you know about dinosaurs with your family.



Borrow a dinosaur book from a library. Share it with your family or bring it to school.



Create a picture of a dinosaur using collage materials (for example natural materials, paper, tissue paper, straws, buttons, feathers, foil etc.).



Draw a dinosaur using 2D shapes. You could include a list of the shapes you have used. For a challenge, describe their properties using mathematical language such as sides and corners.



Create some dinosaur Maths problems. For example: If one dinosaur has 4 legs, how many legs will 5 dinosaurs have altogether?



Create a poem, for example an acrostic poem, about a dinosaur. You might like to wait until we have studied poems as a class.
