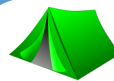
Parking

Covid-19

Whilst we have all got into the swing of new routines and procedures, we wanted to remind you about the extra measures we are taking in school to keep our children, staff and parents safe:

- Staggered start and finish times that must be adhered to
- Distancing markers in and outside of school
- Hand sanitising on entering and leaving the building and classrooms
- Staggered lunch and break areas and times
- Designated areas for each class at breaktimes
- Some pupils will eat their lunches in the classroom
- Lunch eaten in class bubbles
- Extra cleaning throughout the day
- Cleaning stations in all classrooms
- Hand sanitising and handwashing more than usual
- Class bubbles in place with children sitting in rows facing the front
- Playtimes in class bubbles in designated areas
- No communal gatherings for assembly etc and whole school assembly done via TEAMS
- Minimising the transfer of items from home to school
- Any necessary visitors wear masks

We have Mrs Stocks, Kirsty, Henry and Moppy cleaning every evening and at midday, everyday.

Please can we also remind you to use the Covid form on our school website to let us know the outcomes of any test results and also notifying us of any symptoms etc.
